Pastor's report for October 2017

October really started for me with the annual church retreat day. Thank you to Mary for allowing us to use her space free of charge. A dozen of us met to share some time together, walk together, and plan worship together. Thank you to Stephen, who crafted a lovely opening worship service, and Rev. Peta who put together both a wonderful workshop on healing plants, and our closing worship. I led a couple of meditations - to mixed reviews! Some people loved them, some were ambivalent, and some absolutely hated them. However, we had a lovely lunch together and planned worship for the coming year.

Subsequently the order of service has changed slightly to accommodate an introduction to the Acclamation and a highlighted request for quiet during communion. I was also asked to invite fewer guest speakers in the coming year and preach more myself. It can be quite a struggle to find the time it takes to properly craft a message, but rev. Peta is now on the team and has proven to be a great preacher. Rev. Peta and Stephen have created a prayer team responsible for worship prayers. I'm not only grateful to have one less chore, and a great preacher, I'm looking forward to a variety of prayerful interactions with God each Sunday.

My surgery went well. I didn't have to take time off from the church, and only half a day from work. However, I wasn't able to meet a couple of commitments so a big thank you to Dameon for representing me at *A Night with the Stars* and to Chris who went along to support the Forum at *The Day of Hope* event.

There is an update to the lent Queering Christianity program brought together by James Stewart, Charlie Notley, and myself. It will now run on Wednesdays instead of Mondays (Feb 21,,28, Mar 7, 14, 21, 28,), finishing the Wednesday of Holy Week. This is because the day centre is occasionally used on a Monday evening for internal meetings so wouldn't be available for all the meetings. A reminder that the group will pose questions like: *What is the good news really? Who was Jesus? What is the Bible? What is the trinity? Does God approve of you being LGBTQ? What is Easter?* On Easter Sunday we'll be holding a baptismal service at Nigel's pool.

During October I made two pickle fund payments of £20 each, and Sarah also made a payment of £20.

Everything went well with Rev. Brandan Robertson's visit, and it was great to see him again. He is preaching a really sound and well grounded LGBT affirming theology and I'm proud that we were able to act as a launch pad here for that. Although it was a small group, 18 of us, there were a few local clergy who I believe felt challenged by his message.

I did another two episodes of Queersay with Andrew Kay. I also did an interview for Viva magazine, which will be in the December edition. I believe that the magazine is free.

Last week the LGBT Community Safety Forum held their annual AGM and I was voted onto the board. (I had been previously been co-opted). I'm hoping that the role will help to bridge the gap between church and community and create more opportunities for us to be involved at a community level.

Plans for Soul Safari are moving ahead although we have less time on the 18th than originally planned and have to finish my 2pm. We'll talk as a team how to meet this challenge so - watch this space!
